Responding to Foodborne Illness in Long Term Care Facilities....a Guide for Administrators, Nurses and Staff

The Halifax District of the Florida Environmental Health Association and the Volusia County Health Department are pleased to announce its first annual 2-hour food service, continuing education course for Assisted Living Facility (ALF) administrators, nurses, staff or others interested in food safety. The course will discuss foodborne illness in Long Term Care Facilities, its causes/signs/symptoms and provide tips for outbreak response and control. The course will be taught by a registered sanitarian with the Volusia County Health Department and is designed to meet the Food Service continuing staff training requirements specified in Chapter 58A-5.0191(6) FAC for ALFs.

Prior to the class, Halifax District FEHA will also be hosting an open forum during the buffet lunch. Representatives from the Volusia County Health Department, the Agency for Healthcare Administration, Florida Assisted Living Association and the Florida Center for Assisted Living will be available during lunch to answer your ALF sanitation, food safety, construction/licensing and operation questions.
